Background

- February 2010 Board of Education adopts Master Plan
- Master Plan called for the establishment of a system of "attractive school options to provide desirable choices and deepen student, family and community engagement in the youths' lives and education."
- Proposal teams submitted RFP (request for proposals), which were reviewed and determined to align with the District's vision, mission, and guiding principles
- Five proposal teams were allocated money from Measure A for further proposal development

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• Final proposals were submitted on December 1, 2011

Background (continued)

- On February 14, 2012, the Board ratified approval of the following proposals:
 - 1. 21st Century Learning at Bay Farm (Innovative)
 - 2. Earhart Math, Science, and Technology with the Integration of Music (Innovative)
 - 3. Encinal 6-12 (now known as Junior Jets, Magnet School)
 - 4. Global Education through the Arts (now known as Maya Lin School, Magnet School)
- Annual review of progress guideline and rubric developed for evaluation of magnet schools and innovative programs

Background (continued)

- Opened August 2012
 - 21st Century Learning at Bay Farm (Innovative)
 - Earhart Math, Science, and Technology with the Integration of Music (Innovative)
 - Maya Lin School
- Junior Jets team engaged in extended planning during the 2012-13 school year
- Opened August 2013
 - Junior Jets

21st Century Learning at Bay Farm

- 2013-14 Enrollment 561 (includes 110 6th and 7th graders)
- Current Focus
 - Implementing seventh grade
 - Working on Common Core infused with 21st Century Skills
 - Building capacity in use and integration of technology with both formal professional development and by leveraging teacher expertise
 - Planning for addition of eighth grade in 2014-15



Earhart M(STM)

Math, Science, and Technology with the Integration of Music

- 2013-14 Enrollment 618
- Current Focus
 - Building depth and complexity into science and math by integrating technology and music
 - Integrating Common Core into the existing science and math work
 - Providing all students with rich, hands on, science experiences
 - Working on strengthening the technology component of the program
 - Using music to strengthen vocabulary acquisition and conceptual understanding

Maya Lin School

- 2013-14 Enrollment 325 (includes 20 Transitional-K students)
- Current Focus
 - Working towards full realization of the vision of an arts integration magnet
 - Year one focused on new learning for all staff
 - Year two focused on strengthening and expanding those practices
 - Integrating the Studio Habits of Mind (SHOM) across subject areas
- Maya Lin staff has determined that it is in the best interest of the school to delay the decision to expand to K-8 until the 2016-17 school year.

Junior Jets

- 2013-14 Enrollment 184
- Current Focus
 - Building a strong instructional program that serves neighborhood kids in a 6-12 setting
 - Building strong relationships with students and families
 - Creating sustainable structures
 - Working through the logistical challenges of opening a new school and integrating it with an existing school
 - Planning for growth in 2014-15

Review of Progress (ROP) 2013-14

- Previous ROP was too writing intensive
- Modifications will include staff input in various contexts
- Will reduce writing load on administrators, capture clear picture of progress
- 2013-14 ROP will include the following
 - Online teacher survey (anonymous)
 - Constructivist Learning Groups Protocol
 - SPSA Addendum (modified from the 2012-13 ROP)



Constructivist Learning Groups Protocol

- Protocol: Structured conversation led by a facilitator
 - Purpose: to analyze a particular issue
 - Uses the lens of student work to analyze successes and next steps
 - Facilitated by Educational Services staff
- Protocol structure allows teacher expertise and knowledge to "drive" the conversation
 - Teachers work in small groups
 - All voices are heard



Request for Proposals (RFP) 2013-14

- RFP distributed to site staff via CSS Weekly in November.
- Two versions of the RFP
 - New Programs
 - Replications of Existing Programs
- Interested groups encouraged to schedule meetings with Kim Kelly prior to starting their application.
